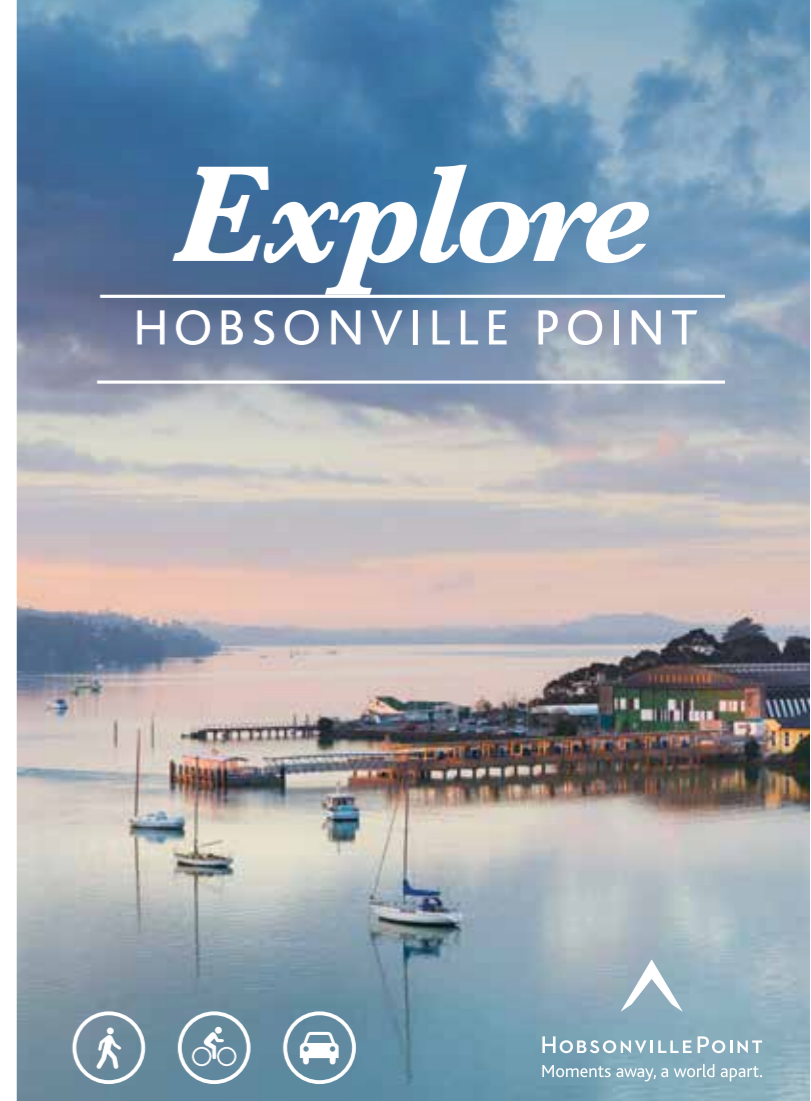

#### HOBSONVILLE POINT

**PARK AND CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND**  
Our award-winning playground is a beauty and resilience of our native flora, and a whole lot of fun for kids.

**MILL HOUSE**  
Mill House was built in 1929 by aviation industry pioneers, Doug and Audrey Mill, as their family home. Mill House has new owners and will serve as a childcare centre from early 2018.

**HQ BUILDING**  
The repurposed defence force headquarters will soon be available for use by the community through a Defence Memorial Auckland Council.

**SUNDERLAND LOUNGE**  
This former Air Force cinema and hall is available for hire as a community hall through Auckland Council.

#### OVAL

This heritage oval was used as a parade ground. It will be kept as a reserve for the community.

**- Former Officers Houses**  
These waterfront homes will be sold in the future.

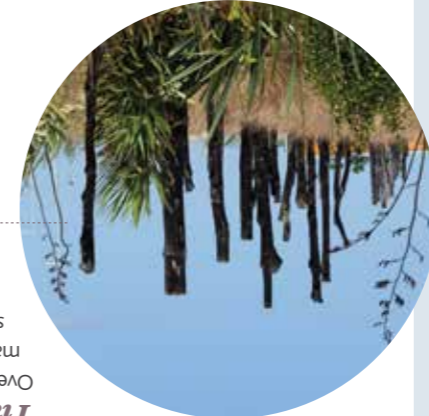
**CATALINA BAY**  
This is where the seaplanes used to be launched from. It will become a waterfront hub for the community with shops, cafes, apartments and offices.

**- Ferry Wharf**  
Hobsonville Point has a commuter ferry service to downtown Auckland (see over for details)

**HARRIER POINT PARK**  
Besides stunning views this park will feature a large lawn area, barbecue, public exercise equipment, flying fox and a bucket swing.

#### BOMB POINT

You're welcome to explore on foot or by bike. Currently under negotiation for sale to Auckland Council.



#### *Tiatawata* by John Reynolds

Over 100 charred poles make up this landscape sculpture, which marches across the land dissecting Hobsonville Point Park.



#### *Remnants of Flight* by Nick Eagles

This sculpture represents an inventory of past lift-offs and landings, linking the site to its former life.



#### *The Memory Windmills* by Leon van den Ejkel

Remember those colourful windmills on a stick you could buy from fairs when you were a child? This sculpture recalls the simple joy the artist felt running home with his windmill held up to the breeze. (The windmills have been temporarily removed for maintenance.)



#### *Estuarine* by Louise Purvis

Inspired by Hobsonville Point's waterways, Estuarine winds its way over and around a gabion retaining wall. The work is made of tubular baskets filled with scoria.



#### *Hinaki* by Virginia King

Hinaki, conceived as both a symbolic eel trap and a guardian, stands watch at the end of the wharf welcoming commuters home.



#### *Tree Cosy* by Alison Milne, Knitted Graffiti

Guernilla knitting has become something of a worldwide phenomenon. Our beautiful example utilises a heritage pohutukawa as its canvas. Tree Cosy has a limited life span, so come and see it soon.



#### *Clip, Tool, Heart of Stumps* by Steve Woodward

These three stone sculptures reference the regimented nature of military life, the pre and post-development landscape, and the ancient trees that once covered the area.



#### *From the Ground Up* by Tiffany Singh

With students of Hobsonville Point Primary. This collaborative installation draws inspiration from the Japanese Torii gate tradition, the purpose of which is to divide our world and the spirit world.
