THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE

Living in a community that is still under construction requires some patience. The key thing to remember is that the situation is temporary. If there is work going on in the immediate vicinity of your new home, it will come to an end and the builders and trades will move to a new area.

Unfortunately, construction is a messy activity. HLC actively manages our developer partners, builders and contractors to keep them meeting deadlines. We make sure they keep public safety top of mind, that they fence off earthworks, and remediate damaged landscaping.

ON-STREET PARKING

Many of our new residents express concerns about a lack of street parking. Again, please be patient. Builders and trades use some of the on-street parks while they're in your immediate neighbourhood, but once they have moved on, there is more than adequate parking available. Hobsonville Point provides higher numbers of street parks than the Council requires. To help everyone, we encourage you to use your garage – should you have one – for your car. There are many storage solutions available these days that allow you to maximise garage space. Head-height shelves, lockers and bike racks can store items off the floor while keeping them accessible.

TRANSPORT

BUS

To City Centre: The fastest way to get to the city centre is on route 120 bus from Squadron Drive (western side) to Constellation Station and transfer to the Northern Express via the Northern Busway to Britomart. Alternatively, route 112 or 114 buses to Westgate and transfer to route 110 bus via the North-western Motorway.

To North Shore: Catch route 120 bus from Squadron Drive (eastern side) direct to Henderson via Westgate.

To Henderson: Catch route 120 bus from Squadron Drive (western side) to Constellation Station and transfer to a bus route from there.

To Westgate: Either catch route 120 bus from Squadron Drive (eastern side) or route 112 or 114 buses from the ferry terminal or Hobsonville Point Road bus stop.

ART

The Hobsonville Point Coastal Walkway is a 5km walking-loop that doubles as Hobsonville Point's free public art gallery in the landscape. Here are some of the works we've installed so far:

Hinaki, by sculptor Virginia King, is inspired by the traditional form of the Maori eel trap (hinaki) and is sited at the end of the ferry wharf.

Remnants of Flight, by landscape artist/designer Nick Eagles, is situated in the plaza on the corner of Hobsonville Point Road and De Havilland Road. Each slice of granite replicates the 'V' form of a bird in the moment of flight.

The Memory Windmills, by artist Leon van den Eijkel, replicates the coloured windmills on a stick enjoyed at the fairground and is sited close to Hobsonville Point Primary School.

Tiwatawata, by artist John Reynolds, is formed from 108 charred or stained poles which cut a dramatic line through Hobsonville Point Park.

Estuarine, by artist Louise Purvis, is inspired by Hobsonville Point's waterways. Estuarine winds its ways over and around a gabion retaining wall and is made of tubular baskets filled with scoria.

Clip, Tool, Heart of Stumps, by artist Steve Woodward, comprises of three stone sculptures referencing the regimented nature of military life, the pre and post-development landscape, and the ancient trees that once covered the area.

Tree Cosy, by Alison Milne of Knitted Graffiti, is a knitted piece of art on Hobsonville Point Road's pohutukawa tree. The cosy was made with the help of a team of local volunteers.

From the Ground Up, by Tiffany Singh and students from the Hobsonville Point School, is an installation of four gates inspired by the Japanese Torii gate tradition. Items are hung from gates and change from time to time.
